CoGS would like to extend a big 'thank you' to everyone for the harvest donations. Your generosity is always much-appreciated from those in need in our local community.

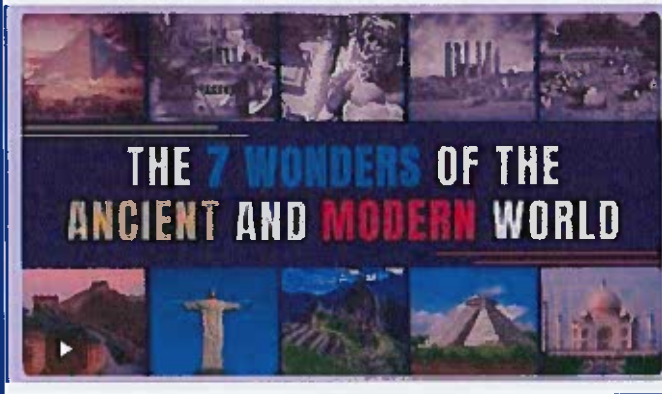
